


"We believe the Scriptures - the 39 books of the Old Testament and 27 books of the New Testament - provide God's authoritative written revelation to mankind (2 Timothy 3:16-17; 1 Thessalonians 2:13; Galatians 1:12). God interacted with the human writers of those books so that every word of the original texts was exactly as He wanted (2 Peter 1:20-21) and without error (John 17:17). The Scriptures are the supreme and final authority ({Psalms 19:7-11; Ps 119; Romans 10:17; Hebrews 4:12)."

History – Old Testament




- Written in Hebrew By about 200 BC, Hebrew was a dying language not spoken by very many Jews
- People Spoke Aramaic
- The first full translation Septuagint (LXX)
- Other translations were made into nearly every language then spoken
- About 800 manuscripts or parts of manuscripts are available today
 - The Dead Sea scrolls are among the best and are more than 1,000 years older than those used for the King James Version
- Jesus and the Disciples hold the OT as truth.

History – The Septuagint




- The conquests of Alexander the Great in 4th century BC caused the spread of Greek language
- Alexander showed considerable favor to the Jews
- Originally the Torah; then the entire OT
- New Testament quotations are directly from the Septuagint
- Bridged the historical gap between Hebrew OT of Jews and the Greek-speaking Christians
- Jews later lost interest when Christians adopted it as OT
- Remains authoritative text of Eastern (Orthodox)
 Church
- Dead Sea Scrolls agree more with Septuagint than the Masoretic Texts for certain scripture

History – The Latin Vulgate




- Roman influence resulted in Latin rapidly becoming the official language of the church
- One of the earliest Latin translations of the Bible was "Old Latin" (from the Septuagint), which was copied extensively
- By end of 4th century, numerous Old Latin texts existed, leading Pope Damasus, to commission an authorized revision from Saint Jerome
- Damasus died and Jerome moved to Bethlehem, and completed the translation (405 AD)
- Became the unofficial standard text for the Bible, for 1,000+ years and becoming the official Bible of the Catholic Church in 1546
- It served as the basis for most modern Bible translations

History - Masoretes



- Jewish scribe-scholars who worked from around the end of the 5th through 10th centuries CE in Jerusalem and Tiberias.
- Standardized the pronunciation, paragraph and verse divisions, and cantillation of the Hebrew Bible
- The Masoretes devised the vowel notation system for Hebrew that is still widely used.
- •The Masoretic Text is the primary foundation of most of today's Bible translations.
 - Aleppo and Leningrad Codices
- •Although the final version of the Masorah is only about 1,000 years old, it preserves tradition and scholarship that is much older.

History – The New Testament



- Originally written in koine Greek (lingua franca)
- Most translated document in the world by far!
- More than 24,000 manuscript copies or portions of the New Testament (e.g., MSS, unicals, miniscules, lectionaries, papyri, etc.) in existence today
- 2nd is the Iliad with 643 extant manuscripts
- Additionally, we have 32,000 quotes about the Bible
- All but eleven verses of the New Testament could be reconstructed through these writings alone
- The Muratorian Canon Fragment dating from 170 AD lists the same New Testament books commonly accepted today

The English Bible

- That is an Anglo-Saxon (or Old English) translation of the Lord's Prayer
- While it's unclear how the English language developed, Old English was in use from ~450 – 1100 AD, dominated by the influence of the Angles, Saxons, and Jutes
- The first Bible text in written English form was accessible only to the elite, and
 (a) were piecemeal, (b) were translated from Latin, and (cc) rarely contained
 the full text of the entire Bible
- Following the Norman invasion of England in 1066, the language experienced "momentous changes, more extensive and fundamental than those that have taken place any time before or since" – and entered the Middle English period (1100 – 1500) - this was the time of Geoffrey Chaucer





History – John Wycliffe




- Lord's Prayer from John Wycliffe's translation of the Bible in the late 14th century
- He opposed papal authority and the traditional church, believing God alone gives authority and aligning with Lollards (preachers)
- He created the first English translation of the complete Bible from the Vulgate
- NT completed in 1380 AD and OT completed in 1382 AD...hand-written...dozens of copies made
- First time ever the biblical canon it its entirety was made accessible to the reader literate in English but not Latin
- 44 years after Wycliffe's death, the Pope had his Bones dug up, crushed, and scattered in the River Swift

History – Gutenberg Press – 1450's AD



- All the world acknowledges that the invention of Gutenberg is the greatest event that secular history has recorded. - Mark Twian
- Invented/developed moveable type, oil based ink and the printing press.
- Printed medium was now within the reach of the middle class.
 - It took a scribe 2.5 years to write out a Bible
 - Gutenberg printed 180 Bibles in 2.5 years
- Literacy Exploded
- The Bible was now translated into many languages.
- The common man now wanted to read their Bible...the church became the educator.


History – William Tyndale



- The first NT translated directly from the original Greek was produced by William Tyndale in 1526 – also first printed
- Pioneer in use of simple language through poetic aphorism; his Bible is thought to have inspired Shakespeare
- Use of Erasmus' interlinear Greek/Latin text
- Persecuted by the Catholic Church and Church of England, ultimately hanged and burned at the stake
- Final words: "Oh Lord, open the King of England's eyes."
- Inspired all Bibles to come...Coverdale Bible, Matthew Bible, Great Bible, the Geneva Bible




History – KJV 1611



- King James I ascended to the English throne in 1603
- Too many Bible versions creating trouble between sects within the church;
- •Generally considered the first Bible translation to use a "committee-approach"
- Committee...great respect for the Word and considered it inspired by God;
- Few marginal notes and no private comments
- Pub. 1611; technically neither "authorized" nor "version"; for more than 300 years it was the main English translation
- The standard edition of today's KJV comes from a revision in 1769 by Ben Blayney of Oxford
- KJV...protected under British law




